Reception - Mckee


Reception - Mckee have had a wonderful start to their school year. The children have settled in very well and are developing some lovely

We also had a lovely virtual reading session with Mrs Robalo, who read the book 'Coming to England', which the children really enjoyed.



- Click on the retailer you want to visit (there are over 4000 to choose from) and continue your online shopping. 'Easyfundraising' will do the rest for you.

It is so simple – and there is no catch: you pay nothing but the retailers donate an amount to your chosen cause (us!) as a thank you for shopping with them. Everyone's a winner: the retailer gets your custom; the school gets donations to buy more exciting things for the children; and you get to feel good for helping out Spring Grove – just by registering and clicking on a link. 
