Thank you to all Spring Grove parents, carers and families for trying so hard with the home schooling. You have impressed us so much with your talents, adaptability and tenaciousness. We know it has not been easy yet all families have ensured that children have accessed their learning and so many of you have go above and beyond and have made the best of challenging circumstances.

A letter was emailed out to all families earlier this week outlining arrangements for school from Monday 8th March. Please make sure that you read this and are familiar with the arrangements.

We look forward to seeing all of the children on **Monday 8th March**. Please ensure that you arrive at the appropriate time and go straight to your classroom.

### The important bits are:

- ❖ Attendance is mandatory
- ❖ Staggered start and finish times for the various bubbles
- ❖ Both entrances to school will be open
- ❖ Parents to remain off site in the mornings and say goodbye to children at the gate
- ❖ Parents may enter the school site at pick-up times but must maintain a safe distance from each other and leave swiftly once child has been collected.
- ❖ E-mail or phone school to discuss any issues– we are unable to host parents in the building at the moment.
- ❖ All adults and children over 11 to wear face covering when on school site.
- ❖ Primary children should not wear face coverings in school.
- ❖ School uniform is to be worn.
- ❖ Come to school in PE kit on PE days.
- ❖ School lunches available from 8th March. Parents must book lunches online before returning to school.
- ❖ After school provision will start after Easter.
- ❖ Breakfast Club provision will start after Easter if there are at least 10 children requiring it.



## Family Maths Challenge

Hello Mathematicians,

### Multiplication Table Wheel

If any of you know me, you will hear me talking about the importance of learning the times tables all the time. By the end of Y2 you should know and be able to recall the 2, 5 and 10 times table. By the end of Y3 you should also know the 3, 4 and 8 times table and by the end of Y4 you should know all of the times tables up to 12.

Times tables are so important to learn. If you cannot multiply you will not be able to divide. Times tables also helps us to do fractions, ratio, proportion algebra and so many other areas of mathematics.

This week I would like you to make a multiplication wheel. I suggest you choose a times table you need to learn or improve on. There is a link below that shows you how to do this.

## **GET TESTED today**

The chance of a return to normal life on June 21st is not one any of us want to miss.

Hounslow still has one of the highest rates of infections in London.

With schools re-opening on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March there will be more contact between families as parents/guardians drop off and collect children from school. Teachers will be taking part in testing twice a week and we want parents to support this effort by accessing our FREE Rapid COVID testing in the community.

Around 1 in 3 people who have COVID-19 don't show any symptoms and can spread it without knowing. We are encouraging ALL parents/guardians who will be taking children to school to get a COVID-19 test. Our centres are open 7 days a week.
