What a wonderful week it has been! It has been a joy to be reunited as a whole school again and we are relishing being back together and reconnecting with each other. It has been wonderful to see so many children and staff dressed up today as book characters and it is has been a great way to round up our book week activities. The children (and staff!) have also enjoyed the silent discos this week and they have provided an opportunity to relax, express, and have a giggle together which is so important at the moment.

Lessons are currently focusing on settling children back into routines and identifying where loss of learning has taken place. Interventions and booster sessions to support all pupils are being arranged and details will follow in due course where appropriate. We are confident that we will successfully enable the children to achieve their true potential despite the impact of the national lockdowns.

It has come to our attention that several children at Spring Grove have had exposure at home to console games that are aimed at children aged 15+. Often younger children have been playing these games with older siblings but the vocabulary and content is totally inappropriate for primary age children. In addition, some of our younger pupils have been discussing the plots and storylines of inappropriate TV programmes that they have been watching with their families. Please be aware of what your child is watching or playing at home and ensure that it is age appropriate. What children play, watch and listen to does have an impact on the language they use and their social interactions with others.

We have been monitoring our back to school arrangements closely, in particular our start and finish times. We have decided to make some small changes and they will take effect from Monday 15th March.

Please make sure that your child arrives on time for school. We have had some children arriving late all week and this does not support them in settling back into a routine. Developing punctuality is an important life skill and this is expected at Spring Grove.

<u>At the start of the day</u> - children should say goodbye to parents at the school gate and enter school independently.

<u>At the end of the day</u> - parents are permitted to enter the school site but should be careful to maintain a social distance from each other. Once children have been collected families should leave the school site without delay. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Family Maths Challenge

Hello Mathematicians,

Each Family Maths Challenge will run for two weeks now, so below is a reminder of the challenge. I'm really looking forward to seeing your multiplication wheels.

Multiplication Table Wheel

If any of you know me, you will hear me talking about the importance of learning the times tables all the time. By the end of Y2 you should know and be able to recall the 2, 5 and 10 times table. By the end of Y3 you should also know the 3, 4 and 8 times table and by the end of Y4 you should know all of the times tables up to 12.

Times tables are so important to learn. If you cannot multiply you will not be able to divide. Times tables also helps us to do fractions, ratio, proportion algebra and so many other areas of mathematics.

This week I would like you to make a multiplication wheel. I suggest you choose a times table you need to learn or improve on. There is a link below that shows you how to do this.
