We have made bar charts and line graphs representing the data of how many people have been recorded since 1931. Year 4 Horowitz were asked the question as part of our class Census,


'What would you like built in Isleworth?'

The Swimming Water Park had the most votes from the class and 28 people voted including the teacher! The Outdoor Bowling Alley and the Outdoor Cinema had least votes.



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
