It has been good to see so many parents attending the virtual parent consultation sessions this week. They are an important opportunity to discuss the progress of your child and to raise any concerns or issues that there may be.



We learned about prime and negative numbers as well as factors and divisibility rules.*

## Family Maths Challenges

### Climate Change

Thank you to those of you who submitted your Rangoli patterns. I loved looking at your designs and seeing the bright and bold colours you used.

This fortnight I really want to focus on using our maths skills to make us reduce gas emissions and prevent wildlife and biodiversity loss. One way we can do this is to think about reducing the amount of water we use when we take a shower.

Your family challenge is for you to take a measuring jug and run your shower into it for 5 seconds. Once you have done this see how much water you collected in the jug in millilitres. Record this amount and use this to calculate how much water you use every minute you have a shower.

Can you use this information to calculate how much water your whole family use to shower?

Could you possibly use less water? By reducing the amount of warm water you use you can reduce greenhouse emissions because it avoids the need to generate energy to heat the water.

Please post your calculations and explanations for me to see.

I collected \_\_\_\_\_ millilitres of water in 5 seconds.

This means I use \_\_\_\_\_ millilitres of water in 1 minute.

My shower takes \_\_\_\_\_ minutes so I used \_\_\_\_ litres and \_\_\_\_\_ millilitres of water.

I also calculated how much water (family members) \_\_\_\_\_ used.

Altogether my family uses \_\_\_\_\_ litres and \_\_\_\_\_ millilitres of water to shower.
