Dear Parents and Carers,

Wow, it was lovely this week to see how much enjoyment the children had from being their chosen book character- great job with book day dress up everyone! During World Book Day we talked about each book the children's characters featured in and the children shared why they liked that book, it was great to be able to hear all the lovely reasons the children shared.



Our Victorian Day will be on Wednesday 16th March.

For our Victorian Day there is no need to buy any special clothing.

- Girls can wear long dresses, skirts and long shirts
- Boys can wear shorts with long socks or long trousers tucked into long socks, big shirts and a tie etc.

In previous years the children have really enjoyed this day and we try to be as authentic as possible and all of the Year One team dress up too!

We have started our Victorian topic and have been looking at different aspects of a child's life during the Victorian era. We researched about some illness that many unfortunate children suffered from, the objects they would have had at home as well as comparing the lifestyle of a rich and poor child. Finally, we have read the story Peepo by Janet and Allan Ahlberg and have looked closely at the many illustrations that depict a very different life to the one the children live today. It is a lovely story to read with many things to talk about and the obvious repeated phrases allows the children to easily join in!

In Maths, we have been learning to find what is 1 more and 1 less than a given number up to 50 . The children have been encouraged to use particular phrases to explain their answer, for example:

1 less than 25 is....

1 more than 25 is ...

25 is 1 more than...

25 is 1 less than ...

You can practice using these phrase at home, and to support the children I have attached a hundred square. We have also been looking at different number sequences involving two digit numbers focusing our attention on the ones digit. We have found out that when adding one more, the ones digit increases one more each time until the ones digit is a nine then the next number in the sequence has a zero ones digit, because that number is a tens number. See if you can spot this number pattern using the attached hundred square.

Last week in our newsletter we shared the children's challenge for this half-term which was to learn a nursery rhyme off by heart and perform it in front of the class. I will upload a list of Victorian nurse rhymes onto our Google Classroom for you and your child to look at and select a rhyme to learn, but I have

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also attached it to this letter. Your child can include actions and props as part of their performance if they wish to.
