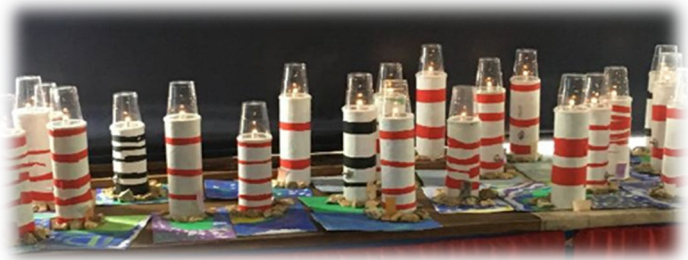


Growing and Seaside

Key Areas of Learning

As geographers, we will compare and contrast the United Kingdom with New Zealand locating them on a world map and we will identify the 7 continents and major seas of the world. We will investigate seasonal weather patterns by comparing different locations in the world. In addition, we will develop our mapping skills by observing our local area to be to recognise different physical and human features.

As historians, we will learn about the achievements of Grace Darling and Sir David Attenborough and think about how their work has influenced our lives today.

As scientists, we are explore different plants and animals and be able to identify them thinking about their characteristics. We will also learn to recognise different types of weathers then we will be able to compare the different seasons thinking about their characteristics.

English

As readers, we continue to develop our love of reading by exploring a range of exciting books in class. We will be supported to develop our comprehension skills using a familiar text and we will continue to develop and apply our phonics understanding in our daily Read Write Inc sessions.

As writers, we focus on consistently using capital letters, finger spaces, full stops and conjunctions while writing. We will be supported to plan and reread our work. We will apply our phonics knowledge (RWI sets sounds 1, 2, and 3) to spell unfamiliar words and correctly spell the red words we have been taught so far.

Maths

As mathematicians, we will develop our place value understanding of numbers upto 100. We will develop and apply our multiplication and division knowledge to solve a range of problems. We will learn to describe the position of a shape or object and use directional language to describe a route. We will make links between our addition, multiplication and division knowledge to learn about simple fractions and we will solve a range of fraction problems using mathematical equipment. We will make and read a clock face and we will be able to read O'clock and half-past times. In addition, we will learn the value of different coins and use these coins to make different amounts.

Computing

In computing, we are TV Chefs who: take and collect photos ensuring that we keep ourselves safe while using the internet; create short films using an ipad and collects and presents data. We will create a digital card using Word to mark a celebration.

Art and DT

As creators, we will use a range of media and techniques to create a drawing, rubbing and painting linked to our topic. We will design, construct and decorate our own lighthouse using junk material.

PSHE

Our next Jigsaw puzzle will develop our strategies to build positive and healthy relationships with people. Our Summer Two jigsaw puzzle is called *Changing Me* and we will be thinking about some of our physical and emotional changes that are taking place.

RE

During our RE lessons, we will be comparing different world religions. We will learn about the beliefs and symbols associated with each world religion that we will be learning about.

PE

In Physical Education, we will continue to develop a range of athletic skills. We will play a range of net games and learn a range of fielding and striking skills to be able to play a team game.

Music

As musicians, we will listen to and evaluate different songs and music pieces. We will compose our own piece of music using a range of musical instruments.

We will plant our own seeds and care for them as they grow.
