Dear Parents and Carers,

This week, we have not only been really busy with all our learning, but we've also been trying hard to be more resilient whilst completing our activities.

In Maths, the children have continued with our place value unit of work, and have been counting in tens. The children are becoming increasingly more confident whilst counting in tens- well done everyone! We have also been focussing on partitioning a given number into tens and ones and writing numbers to 100 using the expanded form. For example, $45 = 40 + 5$. Mrs Sanchez and I were amazed with all the different ways the children were able to partition a given two-digit number.

In Geography, we have been learning about the features of a map and have used a map to locate London. We were then able to use a map of London from 1066 to see how far the Great Fire of London had spread and we were able to sequence the events that had taken place on that fearsome day! We've also been enjoying reading Vlad and the Great Fire of London as it has helped to further develop our understanding of this historical event.

In Science, we have been learning the properties of different materials, and we have sorted different materials thinking about their properties. We learnt that plastic and metal are very durable materials, and that the Three Little Pigs should have built their houses using brick instead of straw and sticks.

In PSHE, we have been continuing our learning linked to our topic 'Being Me in My World', and have learnt about our rights and responsibilities. We discussed what our rights were and what it means to have responsibilities. Please encourage your child to continue to be responsible at home, for example, by tidying up after themselves, packing their school bag and remembering to brush their teeth.

To remind you that on **Mondays** and **Thursdays** a member of staff will sign your child's reading records, please remember to read and sign them daily. Your child should be reading for at least fifteen minutes each night, after reading you may wish to write a comment informing us how they read or if there was any difficulty in your child's reading record.

This week for homework please support your child to complete the attached maths sheet and to look at the attached picture to write some descriptive sentences about what they can see.
