This week, we have been enjoying the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. We have explored the language of 'giant' and what this might be referring to. But if your child has a runny nose lets teach your child how to blow their own noses and bring them to school. It would be great if we could get the children to be more independent. The children are expected to take off their own shoes and put on the school provided welly boots by themselves. We have a huge number of children still needing support with this. The other area the children need more independence in is successfully blowing their own noses. Some children are still needing to be told that they need to blow their nose. It is a life skill for your child if they were aware that their nose needs to be wiped rather than be told. At home, if you point out that your child has a runny nose and then ask your child what they could do about it, they will begin to be aware of the situation. They can then be taught how to wipe their own noses.

It is great to see so many bikes and scooters being used instead of buggies. Well done to all the children and the families for this achievement. The next step is for the children to scooter themselves instead of being pulled along. © Thank you as always for all your support.
